Release of 2021 to 2031 housing-led population forecasts for Oxfordshire, districts and MSOAs


This bitesize presents the Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) population forecasts released March 2023.

At time of calculation, some but not all Census 2021 figures have been released. This means that new data is being combined with older data (as far as 2011), creating some discontinuities. A research programme to review the inputs will be undertaken in the year ahead.

This bulletin compares the latest OCC forecasts with Office for National Statistics (ONS) forecasts based on 2018 population figures, which do not include any Census information.

Important note: housebuilding is a model input, and outputs reflect the expected population if that housebuilding occurs. The forecasts therefore do not indicate housing need, and should not be interpreted as such.


The March 2023 update of the Oxfordshire County Council housing-led forecasts predict a total population in Oxfordshire of 831,200 by 2031, a growth of 131,600 (+15%). Over the same period the ONS projections show an increase of +4%. Differences are particularly apparent for the younger and working age groups. For older people aged 65 and over, the predicted growth is similar.




Cherwell


The housing-led forecasts show the population of Cherwell increasing from 161,000 in 2021 to 185,500 by 2031 (+24,500 +15%).

There are expected to be significant increases in the populations of the Banbury, Bicester, and Kidlington areas with major developments around Bicester; Banbury (south of Salt Way, Canalside, Longford Park); upper Heyford; and around Kidlington.



- The population of Bicester and the surrounding area is expected to grow from 56,200 to 66,100 (+18%).
- The population of Kidlington and the surrounding area is expected to grow from 19,000 to 22,900 (+21%).






Oxford

The housing-led forecasts show the population of Oxford increasing from 162,000 in 2021 to 176,900 by 2031 (+14,900, +9%).

Major housing development sites are at Barton Park, Northern Gateway (near Wolvercote), Thornhill Park and Oxpens.




South Oxfordshire

The housing-led forecasts show the population of South Oxfordshire increasing from 149,100 in 2021 to 171,600 by 2031 (+22,500, +15%).

There is expected to be significant increases around Didcot, Culham, Chalgrove, and bordering Oxford Science Park.

 The population of Didcot and the surrounding area is expected to grow from 37,600 to 47,700 (+27%).

Note that some Didcot-related developments to the west of the town are included in the forecasts for Vale of White Horse.




Vale of White Horse

The housing-led forecasts show the population of Vale of White Horse increasing from 138,900 in 2021 to 166,500 by 2031 (+27,500, +20%).

There is expected to be a significant increase in the population at Valley Park between Harwell and Didcot; Grove Airfield; Dalton Barracks; Crab Hill, Wantage; and land north of Abingdon.

- The population of Wantage and Grove is expected to grow from 19,200 to 25,900 (+35%).
- The area west of Didcot in Vale is expected to grow from 13,900 to 16,600 (19%).





West Oxfordshire

The housing-led forecasts show the population of West Oxfordshire increasing from 114,200 in 2021 to 130,700 by 2031 (+16,500, +14%).

Larger housing developments are planned at North and West Witney, Eynsham, Chipping Norton and east of Carterton.

- The population of Witney and the surrounding area is expected to grow from 36,200 to 42,100 (+16%).
- Carterton's population is expected to grow from 23,000 to 25,800 (+12%).
- Chipping Norton is expected to grow from 7,200 to 10,100 (+39%).
