

2011 Census Briefing - Release 2: Migration - Year of Arrival





Year of arrival in the UK

- The Census asked residents who were not born in the UK to give the year they arrived in the country.
- Over the course of the decade, the number of people rose, reaching a peak in 2007-09.
- The large increase after 2004 shows the impact of the eastward expansion of the European Union, especially in Oxford.
- 6.6% of Oxford's population arrived in the UK in 2007-09
- The number of people who arrived in 2010-11 is noticeably lower, likely reflecting the economic situation.
